Riley K. Lee

Dr. Riley Lee is recognized internationally as an outstanding performing artist of the *shakuhachi* (a traditional Japanese flute). He is highly respected by Japanese musicians, music critics, scholars and audiences and is the most famous and influential of any *shakuhachi* performer of non-Japanese ancestry. Riley has made over fifty commercially released recordings and has performed all over the world. He received his PhD degree in ethnomusicology from the University of Sydney and was instrumental in creating a professional presence of traditional

Japanese music in Australia. In 1980, he was given the rank of Dai Shihan (grand master). Taking leadership in the international *shakuhachi* world, he has been one of the principal motivators for a series of international gatherings of *shakuhachi* practitioners, re-framing the art as a Japanese genre with an international practice.

Kuldeep Mathur

Dr. Kuldeep Mathur served as Rector of Jawaharlal Nehru University, one of the premier universities in India, and Director of the Indian Institute of Public Administration. Dr. Mathur took the lead in expanding the frontiers of public administration to encompass broader issues of governance. He gave this an institutional form by persuading Jawaharlal Nehru University to establish a multi-disciplinary Centre for the Study of Law and Governance. As a widely

respected senior member of the social science community in India, he has received prestigious awards from the University Grants Commission and the Indian Council of Social Science Research. He served as President of the EWCA Delhi Chapter for many years and helped in its revival.

Dennis C. Zvinakis (posthumous)

Dennis Zvinakis gave tirelessly throughout his career as a Agency for International Development (AID) Foreign Service Officer and development professional in Bangladesh, Indonesia, Sri Lanka and the Philippines. Toward the end of his career, he was the AID representative to the Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN) and Asia Environmental Partnership (AEP). After retirement, Dennis accepted his greatest challenge and achieved his most noteworthy career goals.

He established a USAID Mission in Vietnam in 2004 soon after the US and Vietnam began diplomatic relations. His efforts resulted in the development of an historical program in Vietnam with its emphasis on agricultural development, public health and environmental projects.



THE EAST-WEST CENTER was established by the United States Congress in 1960 to "promote better relations and understanding between the United States and the nations of Asia and the Pacific region through cooperative study, education, and research."

The Center works to strengthen relations in the region and serves as a national and regional resource for information and analysis on Asia and the Pacific. It provides a meeting ground where people with a wide range of perspectives exchange views on topics of regional concern. Officially known as the Center for Cultural and Technical Interchange between East and West, the East-West Center is a public, nonprofit institution with an international board of governors. Located in Honolulu, three miles from Waikiki and adjacent to the University of Hawai'i, the Center's 21-acre campus includes conference facilities, a research and administration office building, and three residential halls.
