Professor Jennifer Rose will address the continuum of violence against women on U.S. college campuses. She will identify the unique challenges and emerging issues for international and immigrant student victims of sexual assault, domestic violence, stalking, and other forms of violence.

Professor Rose is the Gender Equity Specialist at UH Mānoa and provides training and advocacy for students, staff, and faculty with respect to sexual harassment, sexual assault and stalking on campus. Professor Rose also teaches the Family Law Clinic at the William S. Richardson School of Law, focusing on domestic violence and civil issues. She received the law school's "Adjunct Professor of the Year" award in 2005 and 2006.

For the last eighteen years, Professor Rose has been an advocate and attorney working to address gender-based violence and other social justice issues. She began her legal work on social justice issues as a law student at the UCLA School of Law. She is consultant for the Department of Justice, Office on Violence Against Women, the Family Violence Prevention Fund, and the Hawai‘i Immigrant Justice Center. Her community work is currently focused on increasing linguistic and cultural access issues for immigrant populations, community-driven preventative strategies for changing social norms regarding sexual violence and intimate partner abuse, and grassroots organizing efforts to build community capacity to address violence against women.
