➤ Study for a Master's degree in Finance, Master of Accounting, Information Systems, or Law at the University of Hawai'i with the PROJECT Governance (ProGov) Graduate Fellowship! The Fellowship covers full tuition, fees, housing, health insurance, living stipend, and round-trip travel from home country to Hawai'i for promising young leaders from Pacific Island countries. ProGov Fellows earn a one-year professional Master's degree at the University of Hawai'i while living in residence at the East-West Center.

The ProGov Fellowship is an important element of the larger <u>PROJECT</u> <u>Governance</u> initiative: Promoting Just, Engaged, Civic-minded, and

Transparent (PROJECT) Governance in the Pacific, funded by the United States Agency for International Development (USAID). ProGov Fellows will participate in PROJECT Governance activities and contribute to creating a stronger Blue Pacific region, both during and after their professional studies at the University of Hawaiʻi.

Eligibility criteria

You may apply for this Fellowship opportunity if you are:

- \bullet Between the ages of 23-35 years old.
- A citizen of one of the following Pacific Island countries: Federated States of Micronesia, Fiji, Kiribati, Marshall Islands, Nauru, Palau, Papua New Guinea, Samoa, Solomon Islands, Tonga, Tuvalu, or Vanuatu.
- Currently working in or experienced with fields relevant to Pacific governance.
- Able to live in Hawai'i for one year to complete your study.
