The PROJECT Governance Graduate Fellowship

➔ **Study for a Master's degree in Finance, Master of Accounting, Information Systems, or Law at the University of Hawai'i with the PROJECT Governance (ProGov) Graduate Fellowship!** The Fellowship covers full tuition, fees, housing, health insurance, living stipend, and round-trip travel from home country to Hawai'i for promising young leaders from Pacific Island countries. ProGov Fellows earn a one-year professional Master's degree at the University of Hawai'i while living in residence at the East-West Center.

The ProGov Fellowship is an important element of the larger [PROJECT Governance](#) initiative: Promoting Just, Engaged, Civic-minded, and

Transparent (PROJECT) Governance in the Pacific, funded by the United States Agency for International Development (USAID). ProGov Fellows will participate in PROJECT Governance activities and contribute to creating a stronger Blue Pacific region, both during and after their professional studies at the University of Hawai'i.

- Master of Science in Finance
- Master of Science in Information Systems
- Master of Laws

Eligibility criteria

You may apply for this Fellowship opportunity if you are:

- Between the ages of 23-35 years old.
- A citizen of one of the following Pacific Island countries: Federated States of Micronesia, Fiji, Kiribati, Marshall Islands, Nauru, Palau, Papua New Guinea, Samoa, Solomon Islands, Tonga, Tuvalu, or Vanuatu.
- Currently working in or experienced with fields relevant to Pacific governance.
- Able to live in Hawai'i for one year to complete your study.
