Dr. Jefferson Fox is Director of the Research Program at the East-West Center. He conducts research on land-use and land-cover change in Asia and the impact of these changes on the region and the global environment.

Dr. Victoria Keener is Research Fellow at the East-West Center and Principal Investigator of the Pacific Regional Integrated Sciences & Assessments. She conducts research in climate science, and she leads efforts to reduce the vulnerability of Pacific Island communities to climate change.

Dr. Andrew Mason is Senior Fellow at the East-West Center and Professor of Economics at the University of Hawai'i at Mānoa. He is also co-director of the National Transfer Accounts project, a global effort to improve understanding of how population growth and changing population age structure influence economics, gender and policymaking.
