



Born in 1944, Ambassador Kasio Mida graduated from Xavier High School before attending Rockhurst College in Kansas City, Missouri, where he graduated in 1968 with a Bachelor of Arts Degree in Political Science.

Between 1968 and 1983, he served as a Political Affairs Advisor in the Truk (Chuuk) District, Personnel Specialist in the Department of Personnel in the Trust Territory of the Pacific Islands Administration in Saipan, Personnel Officer in the Truk (Chuuk) District, Administrative Officer for the Interim Congress of the Federated States of Micronesia, and as Personnel Officer for the new FSM National Government.

From 1983-1986, Ambassador Mida was Special Assistant to President Tosiwo Nakayama, first president of the FSM, and, for 18 years, from 1986-2004, served as the FSM Consul

General in Honolulu, Hawai'i.

He continued his diplomatic work as the FSM Ambassador to Japan and FSM's non-resident Ambassador to the People's Republic of China and the Republic of Korea from 2004-2008.

Immediately prior to his current position, he was Chief of Staff to FSM President Emanuel "Manny" Mori and is now Senior Headquarters Executive, Micronesia Registration Advisors, Inc., which specializes in assisting corporations or individuals to establish subsidiaries in the FSM.

Ambassador Mida is married to the former Ginger Porter Mida of Pohnpei, FSM Postmaster General. They have nine children.
