



Emmanuel "Manny" Mori is the former President of the Federated States of Micronesia, serving two terms from 2007-2015.

Born in Chuuk in 1948, he is a graduate of Xavier High School ('69) and the University of Guam ('73), where he completed a Bachelors of Arts in Business Management.

Prior to his active role in government service, Mr. Mori worked for 22 years in the development and commercial banking sector in numerous mid- and executive-level management positions. He was President & CEO at Citicorp Credit in Guam and Saipan from 1981 to 1996 and joined the Bank of FSM as Executive Vice

President from 1996 to 1999. In both positions, he demonstrated business and banking acumen that drove institutional growth and ensured financial viability.

Mr. Mori departed private industry and entered the FSM government in 1999. He was elected four times to the FSM Congress and served that body for 8 years before running for and being elected the 7<sup>th</sup> President of the FSM in 2007.

During Mr. Mori's two terms in office, he focused on auditory compliance, brokered major private-public partnerships, established both the FSM Trust Fund and Petrocorp, secured funds for a fiber optic cable network in the country, and more than tripled the revenue threshold for the National Government.

In 2016, Mr. Mori became Director of Institutional Advancement for the College of Micronesia, where he leads initiatives to raise funds among various stakeholders. In this role, he has succeeded in doubling the college's Endowment Fund.

Mr. Mori has four daughters and is married to Emma Mori.
