
ASDP Chapter Report

Mr. Subramaniyam worked as consultant to The World Bank (Public Health, Nutrition and Population Division), New Delhi and former Director of the DANIDA Health Care Project, Government of Tamilnadu. Mr. Subramaniyam became an alumnus of the East-West Center after his completion of the Methods of Multivariate Analysis Workshop in 1992. He co-wrote a translation of "India's Environment" which won the Best Book Award from the Tamil University, Thanjavur in 1986. He is remembered by his wife, Ms. Anusuya Subramaniyam, Mr. Venkat Subramaniyam and other family and the members of the EWCA Chennai Chapter.

- 1. Succeeding Leader position: The Leader-elect, Takashi Mita raised questions regarding the continuation of the Chapter by pointing out:
 - a. Our Chapter's functions for welcoming and sending off grantees are not working as there are very few grantees these days.
 - b. There is no need for regional reunion groups because of zoom availability.
 - c. As for merging with Tokyo Chapter or Chubu-Nagoya Chapter, there may be opposition by Tokyo, and things may not change with merging with Chubu-Nagoya.
- 2. Introduced Travis Seifman as a new chapter member. He has moved from Tokyo to work in Kyoto.

On 8/30 we had a Chapter Board Meeting by zoom. We had a follow-up discussion on the Chapter's future. As the previous meeting on 7/31, several board members reiterated opinions against the continuation of the Kansai Chapter. Chapter Leader, however, expressed his hope for keeping the Chapter going by some ways, for example by merging with Tokyo Chapter. Toru Yamada, an observer and Leader of Tokyo Chapter, expressed a positive response by saying he would discuss the matter at their board meeting.
