

It is a new initiative for the Beijing Chapter to work with external institutions. The engaging session provided a platform for meaningful dialogue and connection, showcasing the rich experiences and achievements of the Beijing Chapter community.

These 5 pillars serve to clarify the EWC vision (promote better relations and understanding among the people and nations of the United States, Asia, and the Pacific through cooperative study, research, and dialogue) by listing the specific organizational process action steps to enable "mutual understanding and cooperation". "Developing and equipping" requires (1) funding from various sources, including the alumni chapters and (2) mentoring, i.e. encouraging and celebrating those alumni who are in their own professions, relationships and communities, living examples of the EWC vision.

Regarding (1) funding, the California Chapter wants to continue to support the EWC and is planning to initiate a donation toward establishing a California Chapter Endowment Fund to



provide reliable future income for fellowship scholarships. We especially recognize the value of a longer time for "immersion and exposure". Such "immersion" best enables the building of relationships and mutual cooperation, both in the EWC Honolulu community and Chapters, i.e. within the country Chapter and with other Chapters.

Regarding (2) convening impactful dialogues that lead to relationship building, we will continue to meet face-2-face-regularly on site or electronically. Our next Chapter meeting will be via Zoom in May 2024. We also look forward to meeting with Hypatia in March when she attends the CASE event in Anaheim. After each meeting, an email is sent out with an update on what happened, including Chapter decisions. Any new names provided to us will be contacted by phone and email. Anil Bhargava very actively tried to get himself and other alumni in the Bay area to participate at the APEC Conference in SFO, certainly an "Impactful dialogue for the country participants". He successfully worked as a Volunteer that week and then reported to us at our September meeting. After the Conference, he had a small meeting with 2 alumni and now is trying to set up a Gathering this Spring to meet with other "northerners". In addition, he has offered to host our Chapter's presence on LinkedIn which will serve alumni who use that communication platform to stay in touch.



Chennai Chapter Report

Summary of Chapter Activities:

On behalf of the Chennai Chapter Dr. S. Rajamani made a presentation on the title "Effects of COVID-19 and its influence in technological upgradation and practices in promotion of environmental protection and occupational health" in the Pacific Basin Consortium (PBC) for Environment & Health program organized by Louisiana State University. It may be recalled the PBC was established and supported by EWC, Hawai'i for nearly 20 years. Dr. S. Rajamani was invited for keynote presentation on the Environmental Protection in Asian Countries in the Chengdu, China during 2023.

The chapter also gave Guidance to School children in improving their communication skills and support during the Michaung Cyclone/Flood during Dec.2023 Tamil medium school with 55 kids, ages 3 to 11 at Mahalingapuram which is being supported for the last 2 years by EWCA Chennai Chapter in association with Rotary Club represented by Dr. Vasanthi Ranganathan. They received flood relief including groceries, bedsheets, clothes, and pencil kits. They also participated in the Christmas day Celebrations.

Dr. Vasanthi Ranganathan led the sessions on working together as a team on peace projects held between 20th to 23rd October 2023 at Nepal.

Promotion of Regional Culture through EWCA Chennai Chapter cultural team member Ms. Shreya Nagarajan Singh (SNS) organized Navaratri & Margazhi Utsavam (Dec.2023) celebrations in Chennai. We share special news that SNS has received a grant from the US Consulate (American Center) for a project titled 'Expanding horizons: Bridging cultures through touch', where we will facilitate a series of storytelling sessions in schools for children with visual impairments. SNS and Chetana Trust have begun these sessions in schools across Chennai, by bringing specially qualified storytellers. SNS anchored the Ektaa Center's Diwali Fest 2023 that was held on 28th Oct.2023 in Orange Country, California

- Chapter Establishment: In October 2023, the members of the Chiang Mai Chapter signed the Petition for Chapter Recognition by the East-West Center Association. This marked a critical step in formally establishing our chapter. In our initial meetings, members actively discussed and identified two primary focus areas:
 - Social Cohesion: Our focus is on fostering connections, particularly with the Burmese community in Chiang Mai, emphasizing the importance of building understanding among diverse local groups.
 - Environmental Issues: Prioritizing environmental concerns, leveraging the expertise of several members to address issues such as pollution in the city.
- 2. Meeting with Ambassador Kelley Eckels Currie (November 5th): We met with Ambassador Kelley Eckels Currie, introduced our chapter, and discussed our plans. She encouraged us to expand our reach, promote EWC activities in the region, and ensure a diverse representation in our chapter. During our conversation, we shared perspectives on political situations in Myanmar and Thailand, recognizing the importance of diplomatic ties for providing humanitarian aid to vulnerable populations in Myanmar.
- 3. Dinner Meeting with Dr. Tin Myaing Thein and Marni Suu Reynolds (November 15th): We hosted a dinner meeting with Dr. Tin Myaing Thein and her daughter, Marni Suu Reynolds. We introduced our recently established chapter, and Dr. Myaing encouraged us to consider hosting the upcoming EWC/EWCA International Conference in 2025 at Chiang Mai. Also, Marni expressed interest in collaborating with us on mental health issues within the community.
- 4. Outing with Myaing Family (November 21st): An informal outing with the Myaing family further strengthened our connections and provided an opportunity for more personal interactions.
- 5. Loy Kratong Festival Gathering (November 28th): On November 28th, a small gathering was held with Yuting Zhou and Jessica Khin to celebrate the Loy Kratong Festival. This cultural event allowed us to enjoy each other's company and foster a sense of community.
- 6. Sanggadee Space Exhibition Gathering (December 3rd): A small gathering with Benjaluck Denduang and Sitthichat Sukpholtham at the Sanggadee Space Exhibition in



Nature provided a platform for exploring and appreciating the diverse food and handicrafts from northern Thailand and Burma.

Seoul Chapter Report

Summary of Chapter Activities:

- 1. Dr. Eun Young Cho (American Studies, 1985-89) and Mr. Chan Namkoong (Asian Theatre, 2001-03) participated in the first virtual East-West Center Association (EWCA) General Membership Meeting on November 1, 2023 at 4 pm HST (in Seoul, November 2, 2023 at 11 am)
- 2. President Suzanne Vares-Lum hosted a luncheon meeting for selected alumni on November 2, 2023, at Boccalino Restaurant in the Four Seasons Hotel in Seoul. This event took place during her visit to Korea at the invitation of the Korean Ministry of Foreign Affairs. The meeting participants from Seoul include Dr. Yanghee Lee, Board of Governors, East-West Center; Dr. Kwangsuck Lee (Resource Systems Institute, 1983); Ms. Seong Yoon Cho (Seoul Conference 2018), Communication Liaison; Mr. Linus Ikpyo Hong (APLP, 2016), Portfolio Management Specialist, Green Climate Fund; Prof. Leif-Eric Easley (POSCO Visiting Fellow, 2016), Professor, Ewha University; Ms. Yuseon Jeong (Student Affiliate, Master's Degree in Music, 2022), Music Teacher, Seoul Metropolitan Office of Education; Ms. Juhyoung Hong (Korea-US Journalists Exchange, 2023), Reporter, The Segye Times; and Mr. James Kim (Collaborator, EWC Washington) Lecturer, Executive Master of Public Policy and Administration Program at Columbia University.

At the meeting, President Vares-Lum elaborated on the importance of alumni chapters strategically aligning their efforts to support the plan/pillars of EWCA. She particularly emphasized the significance of 'Korea Matters for America' and 'Korea Matters for Hawai'i.'

- 3. An event for celebrating for Dr. Choong Yong Ahn's book of *South Korea and Foreign Direct Investment: Policy Dynamics and the Aftercare Ombudsman* at the Press Center, Seoul on 29th November 2023. More than 100 celebrities of Korea's economic and financial fields gathered and shared their review and acknowledgement on his achievement. This book examines Korea's foreign direct investment policy dynamics and points out the importance of mutual synergy between multinational corporations and their host countries in a win-win framework and the increasing importance of this in a post-pandemic world. Dr. Ahn is a distinguished professor at the Graduate School of International Studies at Chug-Ang University in Seoul.
- 4. Dr. Ungsuh Kenneth Park (Industrial Economist, 1964 EWC Grantee and former board member of Chancellor Recommendation of EWC) published a new book titled New Wealth of Nations, Repeating the Korean Economic Miracle. (ISBN 979-11-6072-115-7 Daevang Media) The book explains Korea's economic achievement as an inevitable part



of a multidimensional nation-building endeavor of escaping poverty under one of the most infertile geopolitical environments. This narrative of national transformation from a least developed country to one of the 10 greatest economies with supply capability of arms for the free world is intended to be an easy and provoking reading for the general public. Dr. Park has a unique career of combining an academic economist and corporate management, which he calls a developmental practitioner.
