Among the esteemed speakers featured in the Colloquium were Police Major General Eric Noble (G10) who shared his journey in the Philippine Law Enforcement and the critical role of APLP in his untarnished and celebrated career in the Philippine Police Force. Dr. Christina Gabrillo (G19) shared her leadership insights in education and climate-change projects such as the Radio Drama, Radio School, and Advocacy Painting on Anti-human trafficking. Dian Fatwa (G16) reminisced on the leadership learnings at the height of her career in media as a Professional Senior Executive at the Australian Broadcasting Corporation and thereafter rising in politics as the Secretary General of the National Mandate Party (PAN) in Indonesia. Beijing Chapter Report

Summary of Chapter Activities:

Since its establishment in the summer of 2023, this podcast program has produced, edited, and released four episodes. Currently, the podcast is currently produced with the dedicated voluntary time and work of Professor Yue Cui, the liaison of the EWC Beijing chapter. The interviewees include members who have participated in the Asia Pacific Leadership, Graduate Degree Fellowship, and Changing Faces programs. The podcast aims to evoke memories of Hawaiian life and learning among alumni through the narratives of guests, while also providing first-hand information and experiences for colleagues interested in applying for related programs.

Episode 1: Zhigang

In this podcast episode, the discussion revolves around the speaker's deep connection with Hawai'i. They explore various aspects such as the unique existence of Hawai'i in their minds, personal ties with the Hawaiian culture, comparisons between Hawai'i and Florida's natural environments, the health of Hawai'i's ecosystem, the identity of Hawaiians, and the safety concerns in Hawai'i.

Episode 2: Kiko & Lehua

This episode delves into the theme of self-discovery and leadership. The conversation navigates through topics such as the APLP project, the essence of leadership, the spiritual aspect of Hawai'i, the power of generative writing, joint writing exercises, coaching.

Episode 3: Er Gou & Lehua

The interview highlights the speaker's experiences in Hawai'i, and the insights gained from the leadership program. They discuss the exceptional qualities of their classmates, the enriching collective life and local resources in Hawai'i, the contrast between the atmospheres of the UK and Hawai'i, the significance of the APLP project in connecting different life stages, the journey of brand practitioners to Hawai'i, and the opportunities provided by doctoral programs for personal and professional development.

Episode 4: Wu Ying & Lehua

This episode features an exploration of lifelong learning and leadership, focusing on the speaker's journey from Antarctica to Hawai'i. They share insights from the Changing Faces Women's Leadership Seminar, transitioning from entrepreneurship to social enterprise, the richness of theoretical and skill content in the program, the multicultural essence of Hawai'i, reflections on experiences in Antarctica and Hawai'i, and the empowerment gained from leadership tools.





Message of Condolences

The EWCA Seoul chapter expresses its deepest condolences on the passing of Dr. Mo-Im Kim (at age 88 on Feb 28, 2024). Her academic background includes Yonsei University (Nursing/Bachelor's), the University of Hawai'i Graduate School of Public Health (Health Studies/EWC Master's degree program 1965~67), and Johns Hopkins University Graduate School of Public Health (Health Studies/Doctorate). She served as a professor at Yonsei University's College of Nursing for over 40 years.

Professor Emeritus Kim led the development of the school by serving as dean of the College of Nursing and dean of the Graduate School of Public Health. Externally, she served as dean of the Red Cross School of Nursing, president of the Korean Nurses Association, president of the Korean Planned Parenthood Association, and vice president of the Korean Red Cross. She entered politics in 1981 and served as a member of the 11th National Assembly, vice president of the Women's Political Alliance, vice president of the Liberal Democratic Alliance, and the Korean Women's Political Alliance.

She also served as Minister of Health and Welfare in 1998-99. Internationally, she raised the reputation of Korean nursing around the world as president of the World Council of Nursing and secretary-general of the World Health Organization Nursing Collaborating Center.
